Minutes of the GC

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 5:04 pm by Susie Kimble
- 2. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.
- 3. The mission statement was read by Susie Kimble
- 4. Student of the month presentation. Award winners were
 - Leslie Zamora, 17
 - Alberto Rojas, 18
 - Spencer Griffiths, 18
 - Jordan Salcido, 18
 - Moses Villalobos, 21
 - Joseph Chavez, 22
 - Edna Bailey, 29
 - Catalina Guerrero-Cordova, 43
- 5. Moved by Fernando Macias and seconded by Martha Valdez that the agenda be approved as presented. Votes: Unanimous.
- 6. Moved by Fernando Macias and seconded by Martha Valdez that the minutes of March 14, 2019 be approved. Votes: Unanimous.
- 7. Moved by Fernando Macias and seconded by Martha Valdez that Part-Time Resolution 2019-04-11-01 be approved as presented. Votes: Unanimous.
- 8. Moved by Fernando Macias and seconded by Martha Valdez that the GC award a PSA with Craig Cook and Dominic DiFelice for \$15,000 each for services and expenses for the FY 2019-2020. Votes: Unanimous.
- 9. The first public hearing for the FY 2019-20 budget was held. Highlights of the draft budget included
 - ➤ The draft budget was reviewed in detail by Kyle Hunt
 - The projected reduction in funding is \$56,584 from last year
 - ➤ This reduction is far less than anticipated
 - > Over 21 funding is grandfathered for one year
 - > Small school size is reduced by 20% over the next five years
 - ➤ Going forward the funding will be significantly reduced with no more over 21 funding and decrease to small school size funding
 - > The various cuts to function lines were detailed
 - > \$30K was allocated for consulting services for Dom and Craig
 - ➤ Lobbyists were funded to a maximum of \$10,000 if necessary
 - ➤ Benefits are to be reduced to a 75%-25% split
 - Vacation time payout will be discussed further
 - > Discretionary time payouts to teachers would continue

- A stipend for teachers would continue if the school improved on student achievement, criteria to be determined
- 10. The Finance Committee met prior to the GC meeting. Kyle reviewed the financial reports. Highlights included
 - Revenue report as expected, no surprises. All federal funds received.
 - ➤ One large negative line item in expenditures was explained as an accounting anomaly and will be adjusted accordingly
 - > Some encumbrances in the PO report will not materialize and monies will be freed up
 - > Ending balance in the bank \$1,303,949
 - > Student activity balance \$ 7,877
 - ➤ Unrestricted fund balance \$583,572
 - Restricted fund balance \$720,376
 - ➤ No BARs

- 13. Moved by Jennifer Garcia Kozlowski and seconded by Oscar Juarez that only matters pertaining to a personnel matter was discussed in executive session and no action was taken. Votes: Unanimous.
- 14. Craig Cook indicated a meeting has been arranged with the building representative for FYI/RCY to discuss a lease to purchase arrangement, an extension of the maturity for the lease and a lower monthly lease payment. Craig will update the GC as to discussion that will occur at the next meeting.
- 15. This month's dashboard looked at enrollment based on age and graduation. Benchmark data was presented in Algebra I, II, Geometry, and Language Arts based on growth.
- 16. Principal report: Margarita reviewed a written report to the Board highlighting

 - > \$10,000 received for capital outlay
 - > PARCC testing dates
 - ➤ Donation of \$250 by Steinborn Reality
