- 5. Motion to approve the agenda as presented. Moved by Roberta Stathis and seconded by Jesus Lozoya that the agenda be accepted as presented. Votes: Unanimous.

Dashboard: NM Dash Plan (PED Educational Plan): Our goal is to increase graduation rate by 5%. Our data: 23% for 4-year cohort. Our target: 28%. Over the break, teachers and admin worked on the Dash to identify root causes critical action steps to increase our grad rate. We identified the root cause being that students were not engaged in their commitment to graduation. We are to identify our 4-year cohort students, connect them with a champion mentor and guide them to reach graduation date on time. This might be with credit recovery or to provide them with internships.

- Enrollment for the 40-day count is: 184. Our original count goal was set from last year's 80- and 120-day counts was 147.
